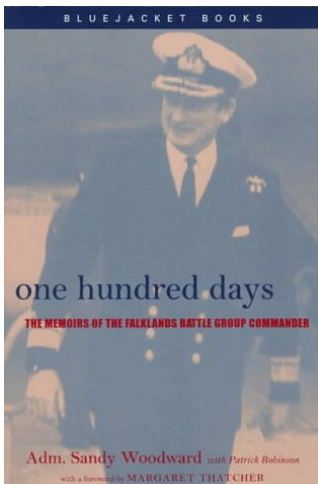

This is not a comprehensive history of the conflict, it is the story of the battle group. This means that the land campaign is not looked at in any detail at all and the amphibious assault is not considered in such detail.
