If, like so many Americans, you read the Little House on the Prairie series as a child, you probably think you know Laura Ingalls Wilder. The semi-autobiographical books did, after all, pull from Wilder's own experiences as a young girl growing up in a pioneer family, moving ever farther westward. Laura Elizabeth Ingalls Wilder (February 7, 1867 – February 10, 1957) was an American writer, mostly known for the Little House on the Prairie series of children's books, published between 1932 and 1943, which were based on her childhood in a settler and pioneer family. During the 1970s and early 1980s, the television series Little House on the Prairie was loosely based on the Little House books, and starred Melissa Gilbert as Laura and Michael Landon as her father, Charles Ingalls. Laura Ingalls Wilder and her daughter Rose Wilder Lane were the women behind the popular book series Little House on the Prairie. Throughout her childhood, Laura endured a tough life as a settler on the frontier, constantly moving and living in near poverty in harsh conditions. When Laura was in her 60s she began writing about her upbringing, her life on the prairie and the hardships she lived through. Her daughter Rose Wilder Lane, who worked during a time of yellow, or 'sensational', journalism helped edit Laura's writings. The books were eventually turned into an iconic TV series by Michael
